Tribute to Life and Ministry of the Reverend Harry Batty,

Methodist Minister in Swaledale 1961 to 1985

It was with a great sense of loss that many Swaledale folk heard of the passing of the Reverend Harry Batty who died aged 83 in Edinburgh on 11th May 2007. Harry retired from full-time Methodist Ministry and left Reeth for Edinburgh in 1985 after 24 years as Superintendent of the then Reeth Circuit comprising eight churches with Places of Worship at Reeth, Arkengarthdale, Low Row, Gunnerside, Muker. Keld, Hurst and Marske. Throughout his long period of service in Swaledale he ministered effectively to these eight far flung church communities singlehanded but always with the faithful support of a modest cadre of Church Leaders and Local Preachers including his talented wife Margaret who like Harry made a splendid contribution to the life and wellbeing of the people of Swaledale. Many of us who were privileged to know Harry as a personal friend can testify to the uplifting experience of sharing fellowship with him ~ whether during worship or in the home - or sometimes simply when we bumped into him out in the street. His devotion to folk who needed a helping hand was awesome, not least at times of illness or bereavement, and at other times when things were not going too well for us (I could cite a number of examples) Harry was the one to listen closely and bring some light to bear - often by affording practical help as well as an unfailing word of encouragement. Born and bred in Sunderland Harry was a keen footballer in his

vouth and was at one time on the books of the then already famous Sunderland Football Club at Roker Park, After being called to preach he candidated for Ministry and trained at established Headinalev then well Methodist Ministerial Training College in Leeds, the home city of his future wife Margaret. Before coming to Reeth Harry and Margaret served as missionaries in Guvana and then became very well loved and respected in and around Thirsk - so much so that those of us who had heard of their popular ministry there were somewhat puzzled to know how the then Reeth Circuit, in rural Swaledale, had managed to attract their interest. Part of the answer no doubt lay in the fact that in good weather Swaledale is one of the most beautiful places in the world to live and work, but perhaps more important for these two, was the warm hearted character and dry humour of its indigenous people, which they found to be particularly worthy of recognition, support and placing on record. Harry Batty may be no longer with us in the flesh but his memory lives on in the hearts of all those who were privileged to know him Keith Jackson



HERE COMES SUMMER!

After last year it did seem like tempting fate to set up a market stall in the Orchard and attempt to do some fundraising over Spring Bank Holiday. Fearing the worst meant that we were pleasantly surprised when it did stop raining (now and then); though the hailstones were amazing - if you were under cover! A lot of people came to buy our plants and fortunately

the Orchard flower borders had some rather good examples of plants in bloom - to encourage the customers to part with their money. Serving refreshments was not an easy option for the volunteers as we had a big demand for hot drink and cake in a rather short time, i.e. when it stopped raining. The string quartet (very snug in the plant stall) entertained a good crowd and everyone seemed to enjoy the afternoon. The good news (for us) was that we took £322 for plant sales over the two days; £189 for refreshments and the sale of Judy's excellent jam. THANK YOU to everyone who helped and supported the Community Orchard.

I do hope that summer, with the appropriate weather, is on the way. Some occasions really need a warm, dry afternoon to make things perfect - like the children's storytelling event planned for the summer holidays. Thanks to a grant from the Arts Council of England, Rhoda Fraser will be visiting the Orchard every Wednesday afternoon (2 - 3 p.m.) as part of her Stories in the Park' project. She will tell stories based on a different theme each Wednesday - dressed in costume. You may have seen photographs of her wearing a fantastic patchwork coat in the local newspapers. Rhoda (Hutchinson), who grew up and went to school in Arkengarthdale, has been entertaining children and adults with poems and stories for many years: now in her fourth season of Ghost Walks in Richmond, Resident Storyteller at the Countryside Museum at Hawes, and outdoors at Kiplin Hall and the Friary Gardens in Richmond. The storytelling events in the Orchard will start at 2 p.m. on Wednesday, 25th July and run every week for five weeks, the last one being 22nd August. The stories are aimed at primary school children, but accompanied children of all ages are welcome. There will be no charge for the storytelling and refreshments may be available afterwards. It is very fortunate for us that Rhoda has chosen to come to the Orchard; I hope that this will be one of those memorable events that will w e want repeat. Brenda Allen 884103

A Day With James Lamb

On the 27 March, we had a map day with James Lamb, a national park ranger. First we looked at local maps of Gunnerside, then some maps from a long time ago and compared them. Then James showed us some compasses and we did a little bit of After work. that we did some - 6 figure! I enjoyed it very much although I didn't get all of it. After, we went outside to sketch the mountain areas around us: it was interesting. Next we talked about a wall that was on top of a big steep hill. Just after that we did a big session of compass work out side.

James told us how to use them and how they work. Right after that we had a walk with only our maps to guide us. We went in pairs - some people took turns guiding us with their maps - most people got it right, but some got it wrong. When we had gone through about 4 fields we used our grid reference to see where we were. I didn't think I could do it but I did, even though it took me a long time to do it. When we were at the river bank we made a mistake, but we soon got it right again. We talked about the fields and the meadows where you could only walk on the footpath because of lambs and the farmers want their grass to grow first; he

also talked about places you couldn't go or you would be in deep trouble. He showed us a building that was on the map but we couldn't see it because it has been recently knocked down. There was a tyre, it was really mucky and some people touched it and got really mucky hands. We were checking our way on our maps all the way. I personally enjoyed it very much. Harry Sunter

Marrick Parish Council

Councillor Barrie Braithwaite was elected Chair and Councillor Keith Stones Vice-Chair at the Annual Parish Council Meeting held on 10 May 2007, Councillors signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office, agreed to accept and abide by the Code of Conduct and completed the Register of Interests. Internal Audit Review The Accounts and Audit Regulations 2003 (as amended in 2006) required all bodies to carry out and report on an annual review of the effectiveness of internal audit. It was resolved to approve the Audit Plan, prepared by the Responsible Financial Officer, which would govern the internal audit procedures of the Council, A review of the audit plan and internal audit would be carried out at each Annual Parish Council Meeting. Clerk's Salary There would be no change to the Clerk's salary. Risk Assessment Following a review, it was consided suitable and sufficient measures were in place to identify and take action on any risks associated with the Parish Council's activities. Code of Conduct The revised Model Code of Conduct for members of local authorities had come into force on 2 May 2007. It was resolved to adopt the Model Code of Conduct including paragraph 12(2). This would give members with a prejudicial interest the same rights as members of the public to speak at a meeting on the issue and then leave before the main discussion and vote. Arrangements for Future Meetings Parish Council meetings would continue to be held bi-monthly at 7.30p,m. at Marrick Institute. Cooption to Fill Vacancy on Parish Council The recent uncontested election resulted in the Council being one member short of the required number. However, as the number nominated constituted a guorum. those members could co-opt a person to fill the vacancy. The Parish Clerk had placed a notice on the parish noticeboards, which had generated interest. After discussion,

it was agreed to offer the position to Mr Guy Wilhelmy. North Yorkshire Draft Rights of Way Improvement Plan The Plan, a statutory document, had been prepared by the County Council with the support of the North York Moors and Yorkshire Dales National Park Authorities. It was about how the management. maintenance, promotion and location of local rights of way could be improved to meet future needs. After studying a summary of the Draft Plan, a response form was completed, which would be forwarded to County Hall. Internal Audit The Internal Auditor had examined the accounts on 18 April 2007 and confirmed they were correct. Copies of his report were given to Councillors. The Responsible Financial Officer presented the End of year Summary of Accounts to the meeting. It was proposed by Councillo Hodgson, seconded by Councillor Richardson that the accounts be approved. Annual Audit The Annual Return for the financial year ended 31 March 2007, had been received from the External Auditors. The Annual Internal Audit Report was completed by Mr Trusson. Members of the Council completed the Statement of Accounts and Annual Governance Statement. Correspondence The Clerk had completed surveys on local housing development and on local government. Information on the County Council's proposals for a single unitary council were distributed to Councillors. North Yorkshire County Council Integrated Passenger Transport had stated a new contract would not be awarded for the Marrick/Hurst bus service, Reeth Community Transport operated a demand responsive service on weekdays if alternative transport was required. Richmondshire District Council Community Offices Review concluded Reeth Community Office was 'an excellent example of a community based facility'. Date of next meeting: 26 July 2007.

Reeth Parish Council May 14 Council Membership Coun Bearpark was elected as chairman. Coun Gardner as vice chairman. Couns Hutchinson & Johnson as green wardens. and Coun Bearpark as market representative. Planning Application Coun Kendall proposed that members of the council should attend a site meeting if a planning application for land behind houses in Hill Close went ahead. Unitary Authority Attempts had been made to invite someone to a future meeting to speak about the implications of the proposed new unitary authority for North Yorkshire but at the moment all speakers were fully booked. Mews Members noted a letter from the current owner confirming that the Kings Arms had now been sold and congratulating all concerned on the work done to improve the paving and cobbling in the Mews. When the new tenants are confirmed a letter will be sent to confirm arrangements regarding storage, collections etc in order to clarify the situation from the start. Playaround. It was confirmed that the council's insurance policy covered whoever was carrying out the regular checks on the playaround and equipment. Councillors agreed that in future the chairman and the clerk could approve necessary minor repairs in order to get them carried out as quickly as possible. A closed bin was required for the playground to avoid litter being blown around or spread by birds. Code of Conduct Councillors agreed to adopt the revised Model Code of Conduct, Gazette Members agreed that the chair of the parish council or a nominated substitute should be a trustee of the Reeth & District Gazette. Tipping. Problems were still occurring with garden rubbish being tipped on the footpath near School House. This will be reported again the †o Ranaer the rubbish was becoming a danger as well as an eyesore. Swaledale Festival Permission was granted for the Swaledale Festival to stop for a short outdoor performance on Healaugh green durina their walk with musical interludes. National Park No council members

wished to be nominated as representative on the National Park Committee. Parish Boundary. A 'No Tipping' sign was required for land near Scabba Wath bridge, however there was a guery as to which parish council was responsible for this area. The clerk would find out where the boundary with Grinton parish was actually fixed. Healaugh Green. The honesty box for Healaugh was ready to install and would be put in place as soon as possible. Christmas Tree. In spite of regular watering the new Christmas tree did not appear to be flourishing. If there was no improvement in the near future it would be Cobbles. A request was discussed for a marquee outside the Black Bull for a party in June. The council concluded that it would not be appropriate as it could set a precedent for future requests and because of the possible effect on other residents. Housing Sue Stokes, the Richmondshire Rural Housing Enabler. attended the meeting to give a presentation on the provision of affordable housing in the area. She outlined the extent of the problems with housing and explained that she was working in conjunction with the district and county councils to identify suitable sites in Richmondshire and with landowners to release underused land. She confirmed that the mix of different sized homes was being carefully looked at to ensure suitability for families and the quality of the building specifications was being set very high. Some sites were being developed in partnership with housing trusts and others in conjunction with private building companies. Coun Kendall pointed out that there were also a number of cases with local families for council houses which then given to families from outside the area, aggravating the situation. Ιf affordable housing was to be provided in the parish the system of allocating it would need to be well thought out. Next Meeting. The next meeting is at 7pm on Monday, June 25, in the Memorial Hall..


